

**FAIRVIEW AREA SCHOOLS' BOARD OF EDUCATION
ORGANIZATIONAL BOARD MEETING
JANUARY 10, 2011**

The annual organizational/regular meeting of the Fairview Area Schools' Board of Education was held on Monday evening, January 10, 2011 in the elementary media center.

I. Reorganization and Committee Appointments

A. Temporary Chairman

Beth Miller, who served as President of the Board in 2009-2010 and continues as a member of the Board, opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. and served as temporary chairman.

B. New and Re-Elected Members

The temporary chairman appointed Merianne Tappan as temporary secretary for roll call.

Diana Danhoff, Randy Shantz, and Anne Tompkins were elected to the Board at the November 2010 election. Their "Affidavit of Acceptance, Eligibility, and Oath of Office" certificates were available at the Board table.

A notice of the regular meeting and other scheduled open meetings shall be posted at the entrance to the principal office of the Board, and other locations determined appropriate by the Board, within ten (10) days of its organizational meeting.”

At the December 2010 Board meeting, Mr. Wilcoxon presented information concerning C.O.O.R. ISD's proposed Special Education millage that would benefit all school districts in the ISD. The Board was asked to vote on the consideration of the proposed millage which would go to election in May 2011 if all school boards in the ISD are in favor.

Neff/Tomkins That Fairview Area Schools request the C.O.O.R. ISD Board of Education to seek a special education millage increase of .5852 mills in the May, 2011 election.

A. Parent Survey on Lead Teachers

An update was given on the results of the recent survey that was given to parents regarding the new administrative structure utilizing Lead Teachers. Overall, the results were positive, but concerns were raised regarding the lack of full-time office staff in the elementary and high school offices. Parents commented that the survey should be administered again at the end of the year as not enough time has gone by to really evaluate the new administrative structure.

B. Foundation Account

There has been no activity in the school's foundation account for several years. If the account continues to remain inactive, the account will be closed and the funds forfeited to the State. It was recommended that a Foundation Committee be established. The Board agreed to discuss this issue further at the next board meeting.
